Free for many. Affordable for all.

Maine's community colleges offer the lowest tuition and fees in New England. For nearly half of our degree-seeking students, Pell Grants and Maine State Grants cover the full cost of tuition and fees. For many, the grants cover significantly more. In all, 80% of degree-seeking students receive grant aid to help cover the cost of their education. And you don't have to be a full-time student to qualify for financial aid. Full-time, in-state students pay **\$4,156** a year for tuition and fees.

We also offer several tuition-free options!

Recent high school graduates qualify for the Maine Free College Scholarship that covers 100% of tuition after state and federal grant aid has been applied.

High school students can earn up to 18 college credits tuition-free through our Early College programs. These courses will challenge you, spark your interest, and prepare you for college.

Anyone can take our low-or no-cost short-term workforce training programs, offered at all seven colleges. Some programs offer weekly stipends, housing, or guaranteed interviews with companies that are hiring.

Maine Free College Scholarship

High school graduates with a diploma or its equivalent since 2024 qualify for the Maine Free College Scholarship that pays 100% of tuition! No need to fill out any paperwork, the scholarship is automatic for graduates in qualifying years!

To qualify students must:

- ▶ Pursue a degree or certificate
- ▶ Enroll at least part-time
- ▶ Fill out the FAFSA and use any grant aid first
- ▶ Be a Maine resident

“TRIO saved me. This is where I blossomed.”

Jadin Wilson nearly dropped out after a hard semester in chemistry. She leaned on tutoring and mentoring through TRIO Student Support Services, earned an A, and graduated from EMCC with a 4.0, then became the first Maine community college student ever named a Cooke Undergraduate Transfer Scholar, one of 60 chosen nationally from more than 1,300 applicants. A first-generation college student, she founded EMCC's cybersecurity and coding club and served in Student Senate. In fall 2026 she transferred to Smith College to study computer science.



What you may not know

Some of EMCC's programs take months, not years. EMCC's commercial driver's license training puts students behind the wheel and into a licensed trade in a matter of weeks, often with grant funding that covers most or all of the cost. It's one of several short-term programs built for people who need to be working soon.

EMCC's health programs are built around where graduates actually go to work. Nursing, surgical technology, medical assisting, radiography, and paramedicine students train in labs modeled on real clinical settings and complete rotations with hospitals and providers across the region.

EMCC is engaged with the local community. The college's building construction and fine woodworking departments build a house every year and donate it to Habitat for Humanity.

In collaboration with local fire departments, EMCC offers fire science students the opportunity to live rent-free in a firehouse. In exchange for being on-call during designated hours, students can study, make professional connections, and gain hands-on experience.

Every Wednesday during the academic year, the culinary arts department hosts a meal in the Rangeley Café that's open to the public. It gives our students great experience and guests even better food.

She has served simultaneously as president of Phi Theta Kappa, the Student Senate, and the Business Club, while also working as a resident assistant and TRIO peer leader. She was the force behind countless service projects and campus initiatives, was both a Worthington and George Mitchell Institute Scholar and was named SMCC’s Student of the Year. She graduated in May 2026 from SMCC’s business management and hospitality management programs and transferred to the University of Southern Maine in fall 2026 to pursue a bachelor’s degree in accounting.



What’s new

SMCC has received \$2.2 million in federal funding to expand its heat pump and plumbing training labs. The investment will renovate space on SMCC’s South Portland campus to create a dedicated heat pump installation and service training laboratory and expand the College’s plumbing training facilities, significantly increasing capacity to train skilled workers across Maine.

SMCC is proud to further support student success through the Advocacy Resource Center (ARC), which connects students with essential resources, including housing, food, healthcare, counseling, and financial aid. With personalized, confidential guidance, the ARC helps students overcome obstacles and thrive in college.

What you may not know

Each year, more students showcase their creativity through Maine Mayhem, SMCC’s annual student film festival. The event continues to grow, with projects recognized by Maine media outlets such as the Portland Press Herald and NEWS CENTER Maine’s 207, highlighting the talent of SMCC’s communications & new media studies students.

SMCC, in partnership with General Dynamics Bath Iron Work celebrated a major milestone in workforce development with the graduation of the 100th cohort of students from its manufacturing technician training program in April 2026. The intensive 120-hour, three-week program prepares students for entry-level manufacturing careers through hands-on, industry-aligned training. Since launching its first cohort on April 3, 2018, the program has trained more than 1,000 individuals across 100 cohorts, creating a direct pipeline to high-demand jobs.

The SMCC softball team made history by winning the 2025 USCAA National Championship, finishing a dominant postseason run with a commanding performance in the title game.

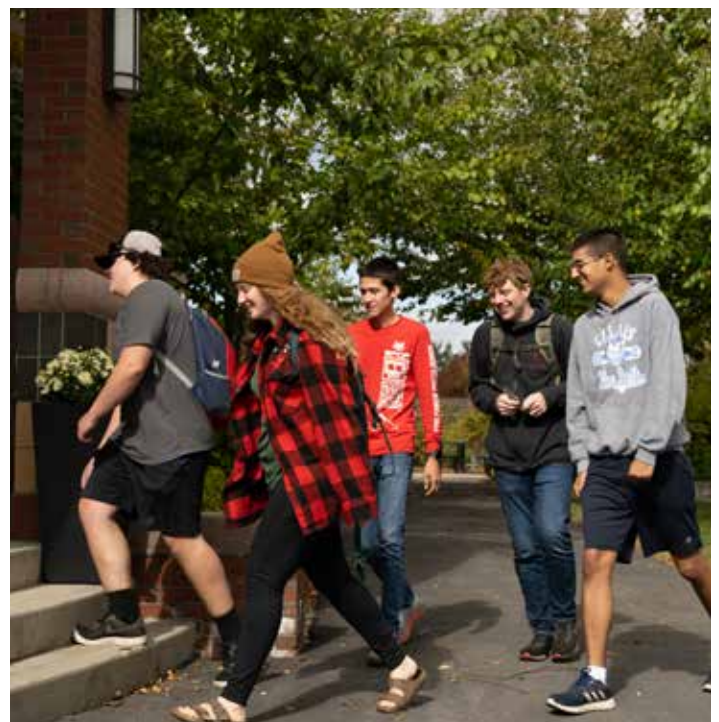


What’s new

WCCC offers the only two-year aquaculture degree program in the state. Coursework includes exploring aquaculture careers to farm site selection, aquatic farming practices, and marine biosecurity. The degree is a mix of online course and practical, hands-on lessons taught in intensive, skills-development lab sections.

A new criminal justice associate degree with a specialization in corrections and probation is available fully online.

The new heating, ventilation, air conditioning, and refrigeration (HVAC-R) program trains students to diagnose, repair, maintain, and install oil-fired heating systems, including furnaces, boilers, tanks, and piping. The program also prepares students to take the Maine State Journeyman Oil Burner License exam.

What's new

YCCC's new one-year welding technology certificate prepares students for employment in welding, fabrication, manufacturing, construction, shipbuilding, and other skilled trades. Students gain hands-on experience in MIG, TIG, Stick, and Flux-Cored welding, along with blueprint reading, cutting, fabrication, welding math, and workplace safety.

What you may not know

YCCC has expanded where, and how, students prepare for Maine's workforce.

In Sanford, YCCC's Center for Excellence in Manufacturing & Trades provides hands-on education and training for careers in high-demand fields such as welding, machining, electrical, manufacturing, and other skilled trades.

Expanded in 2025 through an approximately \$6.5 million investment, the Center features modern training spaces, including a state-of-the-art welding facility, and helps prepare students and current workers for opportunities in Maine's growing manufacturing, defense, and industrial sectors.

In Alfred, YCCC has partnered with the York County Regional Training Center to expand access to education and workforce training in criminal justice, emergency services, public safety, and related fields.

The partnership combines YCCC's educational expertise with a modern regional training facility designed to prepare the next generation of public safety professionals.

Together with YCCC's main campus in Wells, these locations are helping the College bring education and workforce training closer to the communities and industries it serves throughout York County.
