# Free for many. Affordable for all.

Maine's community colleges offer the lowest tuition and fees in New England. For nearly half of our students, Pell Grants and Maine State Grants cover the full cost of tuition and fees. For many, the grants cover significantly more. In all, 82% of degree-seeking students receive grant aid to help cover the cost of their education. And you don't have to be a full-time student to qualify for financial aid. Full-time, in-state students pay **\$4,156** a year for tuition and fees, and between **\$8,100 – \$12,300** for room and board.

## We also offer several tuition-free options!

**High school graduates** from 2022-2025 qualify for a Free College Scholarship that covers 100% of tuition and mandatory fees after state and federal grant aid has been applied.

**High school students** can take up to 12 college credits tuition-free every year through our Early College programs. These courses will challenge you, spark your interest, and prepare you for college.

**Anyone** can take our low-or no-cost short-term workforce training programs, offered at all seven colleges. Some programs offer weekly stipends, housing, or guaranteed interviews with companies that are hiring.

## Free College Scholarship

High school graduates with a diploma or its equivalent from the classes of 2022 – 2025 qualify for a Free College Scholarship that pays 100% of tuition and mandatory fees! No need to fill out any paperwork, the scholarship is automatic for graduates in qualifying years!

### To qualify students must:

- Pursue a degree or certificate
- Enroll at least part-time
- Fill out the FAFSA and use any grant aid first
- Live in Maine while enrolled

Fast track your future with low- or no-cost short-term training programs offered through our Harold Alfond Center for the Advancement of Maine's Workforce. Most of our 200+ programs are grant funded, so there's no cost to you!

We partner with more than 1,700 businesses to create customized training so you learn the exact skills you need for jobs in today's marketplace. Programs take just weeks and months to complete, and some offer weekly stipends, housing opportunities, and guaranteed job interviews with local businesses that have open positions.

Take advantage of hybrid, night, and on-demand schedules; stackable badges and certificates; and scholarships for future degree and certificate programs.

## Scholarships

Want to keep going? We have scholarships available to help you complete a certificate or degree program. Students who have received pre-hire or Compact training are eligible for 50% off two courses each semester.

Our criminal justice students volunteer at many events in the Bangor area, including Penquis CAP Recovery Palooza, St. Joseph’s Hospital Commit 2 Get Fit 5/10K, Festival of Lights Parade, Bangor Region Chamber of Commerce Annual Dinner, Hike for the Homeless, and even serve as referees for a local dodgeball league.

## What’s new

SMCC has received \$4.1 million in federal funding to develop a state-of-the-art health care simulation lab providing more hands-on learning experiences for healthcare students, preparing them for success in the industry and addressing critical workforce needs.

SMCC opened a new Veterans Resource Center on the South Portland campus, providing community, comprehensive services and resources to student veterans.

SMCC has deepened its ties to four-year colleges in the region, particularly with the University of Southern Maine in Portland. Currently, a cadre of SMCC students planning to transfer to USM are living in a new USM residence hall, smoothing the transition between colleges.

SMCC has launched a new podcast, “Bed & Butter: The Hospitality Podcast,” part of a robust business and hospitality department that includes the only post-secondary culinary program in Maine certified by the American Culinary Federation. (The culinary arts student-led team won Maine’s Best Breakfast at the 2024 Maine Restaurant Week’s Incredible Breakfast Cook-Off.) The podcast, co-produced with the college’s communications and new media studies students, gives students real-world experience and showcases SMCC’s innovative and hands-on approach to education.

SMCC has a fleet of new mobile learning labs that bring STEM education and training to communities across the region. This initiative aims to make high-quality STEM education more accessible.

## What you may not know

SMCC sports teams have won over 40 conference championships and have participated in multiple USCAA national tournaments. In 2022, the men’s basketball team won the USCAA Division II National Championship.

## What's new

WCCC now offers the only two-year aquaculture degree program in the state. Coursework includes exploring aquaculture careers to farm site selection, aquatic farming practices, and marine biosecurity. The degree is a mix of online course and practical, hands-on lessons taught in intensive, skills-development lab sections.

A new criminal justice associate degree with a specialization in corrections and probation is available fully online.

## What you may not know

WCCC is one of the few colleges approved to provide prison education programs and continued federal financial aid to students who are justice involved.

WCCC is launching a new nursing program, in addition to offering a new health occupational certificate program to prepare future nursing students to enter the program.

In addition to two-year associate degrees and one-year certificates, WCCC offers a wide range of short-term training programs that include aquaculture, certified medical compliance officer, certified medical insurance specialist, certified medical office manager, commercial driver training, Google career certificates; remote and hybrid work training, and UX design.
