Free for many. Affordable for all.

Maine's community colleges offer the lowest tuition and fees in New England. For nearly half of our degree-seeking students, Pell Grants and Maine State Grants cover the full cost of tuition and fees. For many, the grants cover significantly more. In all, 80% of degree-seeking students receive grant aid to help cover the cost of their education. And you don't have to be a full-time student to qualify for financial aid. Full-time, in-state students pay **\$4,156** a year for tuition and fees.

We also offer several tuition-free options!

High school graduates from 2023-2025 qualify for a Free College Scholarship that covers 100% of tuition and mandatory fees after state and federal grant aid has been applied.

High school students can earn up to 18 college credits tuition-free through our Early College programs. These courses will challenge you, spark your interest, and prepare you for college.

Anyone can take our low-or no-cost short-term workforce training programs, offered at all seven colleges. Some programs offer weekly stipends, housing, or guaranteed interviews with companies that are hiring.

Free College Scholarship

High school graduates with a diploma or its equivalent from the classes of 2023 – 2025 qualify for a Free College Scholarship that pays 100% of tuition and mandatory fees! No need to fill out any paperwork, the scholarship is automatic for graduates in qualifying years!

To qualify students must:

- Pursue a degree or certificate
- Enroll at least part-time
- Fill out the FAFSA and use any grant aid first
- Live in Maine while enrolled

Luke credits his career success to this program and emphasizes the hard work required, but assures us that the rewards are substantial and an incredible opportunity to advance in a high-demand career.

EMCC’s special education program is designed for students already working in the field, offering a flexible path to further their education. Core classes can be completed entirely online, making it easier for working professionals to balance school, work, and life while advancing their skills and impact in the community.

Eight new EMTs are serving Deer Isle and Stonington today because EMCC brought an EMT certification training class directly to their community. EMCC is building on this success and expanding the model to other parts of Maine, eliminating travel barriers for students and helping rural communities strengthen their emergency response staff.

We’re actively engaged with the local community! Our building construction and fine woodworking departments build a house every year and donate it to Habitat for Humanity.

In collaboration with local fire departments, EMCC offers fire science students the opportunity to live rent-free in a firehouse. In exchange for being on-call during designated hours, students can study, make professional connections, and gain hands-on experience.

Every Wednesday during the academic year the culinary arts department hosts a meal in the Rangeley Café that is open to the public and gives students practical experience.

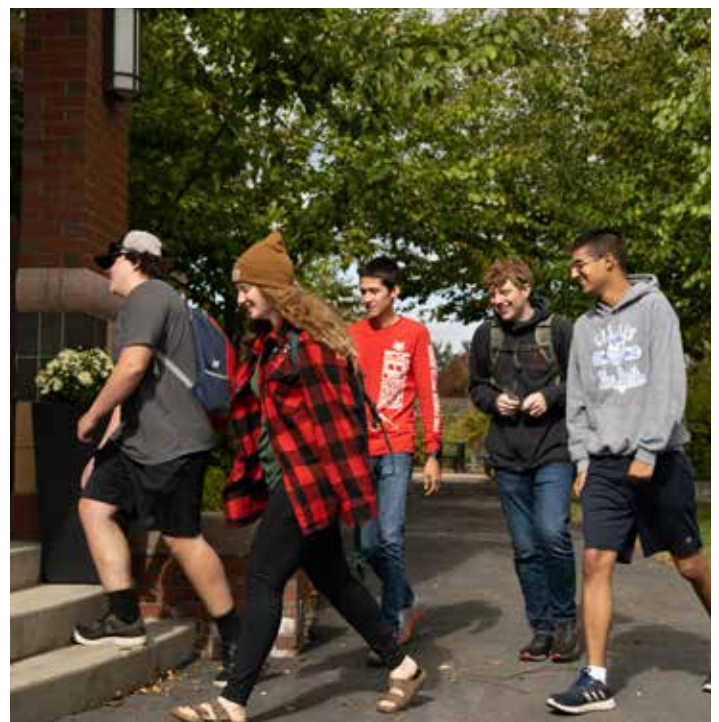


What's new

WCCC now offers the only two-year aquaculture degree program in the state. Coursework includes exploring aquaculture careers to farm site selection, aquatic farming practices, and marine biosecurity. The degree is a mix of online course and practical, hands-on lessons taught in intensive, skills-development lab sections.

A new criminal justice associate degree with a specialization in corrections and probation is available fully online.

The new heating, ventilation, air conditioning, and refrigeration (HVAC-R) program trains students to diagnose, repair, maintain, and install oil-fired heating systems, including furnaces, boilers, tanks, and piping. The program also prepares students to take the Maine State Journeyman Oil Burner License exam.

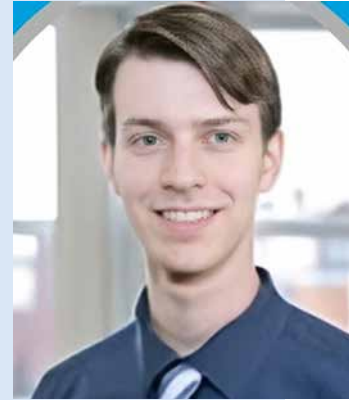
